




IMPACT OF EMERGENCY AID



WHO RECEIVED EMERGENCY AID?


Emergency Aid Recipients: Fall 2020 - Spring 2023




GENDER 64% of recipients are **female**.

PLANNING GRANT LEADS TO \$18.1 MILLION AWARDED TO **BAY AREA K-16 COLLABORATIVE**

On November 2, the Bay Area K-16 Collaborative was awarded an \$18.1 million dollar grant from the state to support education-to-career pathways. The Bay Area K-16 Collaborative, led by the Chabot-Las Positas Community College District, encompasses five San Francisco Bay Area counties and includes two University of California campuses, three California State University campuses, seven California Community College Districts, fourteen unified school districts, the Alameda County Office of Education, five non-profit organizations, seven business networks, and two regional occupational programs.

This past summer, TRIO Educational Talent Search (ETS) hosted a Forensic Science summer camp for our TRIO middle and high school students. As is the case with educational impact, it took a village. Thank you for:

ZERO TEXTBOOK COST (ZTC) FUNDS

Over the past year, Chabot College applied for several state grants to support developing Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) degree or certificate program materials. Multiple applications have been awarded with additional opportunities for funding and collaboration to be announced in the coming year. This has resulted in over 50% of Chabot courses being ZTC.

RECENTLY AWARDED GRANTS

As the college continues implementation of institution-wide Title III Hispanic-Serving Institutions Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics and Articulation (H.S.I. STEM) and Asian American and Native American Pacific Islander-Serving Institutions Program (AANAPISI) Grants, the past year brought several new funding opportunities. Some recently awarded grants are highlighted below.

California Community Colleges: **Culturally Responsive Pedagogy & Practices (CRPP)** Innovative Best Practices (IBP) Grant

- Leads: Carmen Johnston, Kristen Land, Safiyyah Forbes, Christy Davis Roza, Abigail Patton
- \$300,000 over 2 years
- Offers innovative opportunities for faculty to participate in Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Accessibility (DEIA) professional development to improve students' experiences and outcomes.

Eden Medical Center: Community Health Grant

- Lead: Robin Galas
- \$25,000 over 6 months
- Supports expanding Chabot's TRIO Educational Talent Search (ETS) and Hayward Promise Neighborhoods (HPN) programs.

Foundation for California Community Colleges: Nursing Education Investment Fund (NEIF) Grant

- Lead: Tami Washington
- \$216,000 over 2 years
- Aims to diversify the nursing education pipelines by revising the program admissions criteria to be more holistic, offering discipline-specific DEIA professional development opportunities, and providing pre-nursing coursework and support.

John Burton Advocates for Youth (JBAY): Critical Needs and Opportunity Fund Grant

- Lead: Brian Augsburger
- \$6,000 over 1 year
- Supports Chabot's Guardian Scholars Program to directly support the critical needs of youth, age sixteen to twenty-six, who are currently or formerly in foster care or who have experienced homelessness.

Learning Lab's Grand Challenge: Inclusive Novel Curriculum to Leverage representation of Underserved communities in Data science (INCLUDE) Grant

- Lead: Lara Bauman
- \$169,524 over 4 years
- Supports building an inclusive Data Science pathway in partnership with CSUEB.

United Way Bay Area: SparkPoint Chabot College

- Leads: Saleem Gilmore, Stefanie Montouth, Muna Taqqi-Eddin
- \$40,000 over 1 year
- Supports SparkPoint core services, including financial coaching/credit counseling and improvement in any financial category

US Dept. of Education: Childcare Access Means Parents in School (CCAMPIS) Grant

- Leads: Carmen Maria Ortiz, Robert Nakamoto
- \$2,000,000 over 4 years
- Aims to address the need for subsidized infant/toddler childcare spaces and parent supports prioritizing low-income student parents by expanding Chabot College Children's Center capacity and wrap-around supports.

US Dept. of Education: Promise Neighborhoods Program Grant to implement the **Downtown** Hayward Promise Neighborhoods (DHPN) Initiative

- Lead: Robin Galas
- \$1,928,266 over 5 years
- Provides college readiness and transition services to middle and high school students, opportunities to earn college credit, and continues Chabot's work in systems and curriculum alignment with DHPN partners.
